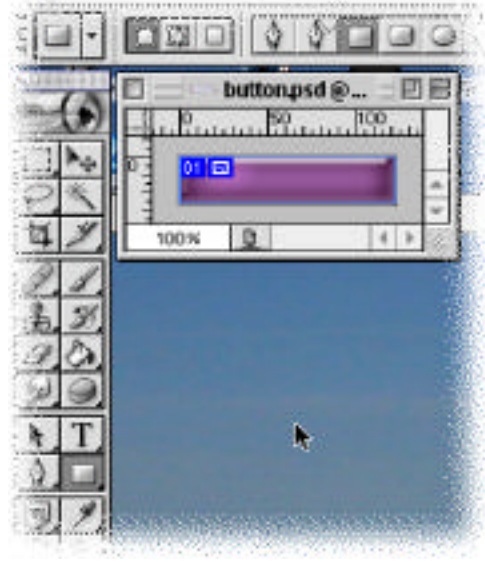




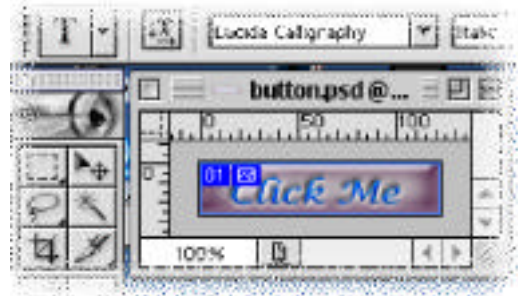
# ROLLOVERS

1. In Photoshop make a new canvas (*File > New*), 130 x 30 at 72 dpi, transparent background.
2. In the Layers palette, make a new layer.
  - Select the *Shape tool* , *Rectangle tool*.
  - In the *Styles palette*, select the *Glass Button* style set and click on the *Plum glass* color.
  - In the *Layers palette*, click on the *Layer Effects* and select *Bevel and Emboss*. Set the size to 6.
  - Select *Color Overlay* and reduce opacity to about 65.



3. Select the *Text tool*, make its color black, and select a font to your liking.
  - Type "Click Me" (drag it to the center if you need to).
  - In the *Layer Menu* select *Layer Style > Blending Options...*
  - Select *Outer Glow* and adjust to your liking, then select *Bevel and Emboss*, and finally select *Color Overlay* and adjust to a blue color.



Note: An important change to the button rollover look will be made by turning off the Color Overlay effect for the plum colored rectangle. We will de-select this effect when we make our final rollover version.

4. Now we're ready to create the two versions of our button in ImageReady. Select the *Jump to ImageReady* button to open the rendering in ImageReady.



5. In the *Rollover palette*, turn off visibility for the *Effects*.
  - Select the *Create rollover state* button and turn on visibility for the *text effects*, turn off visibility for the rectangle's *Color Overlay* effect
6. Select the Preview button to evaluate the rollover effect.
7. After adjusting things to your satisfaction, select *File > Save Optimized As...* and *save images only*
8. Now you open GoLive and build the rollover button where you want it in the page.
